Dat Deus Incrementum (Latin)

Our school motto is 'Dat Deus Incrementum' (Latin) in which 'Dat' means 'gives', 'Deus' refers to 'God' and 'Incrementum' translates as 'growth'. As a whole, it means that 'God makes us grow', [1] which is known as the family motto of Bishop Baker.

'Míng Daò Rì Xīn', the Chinese paraphrase of the school motto that stems from both the Bible [2] and the old Chinese classic Lǐjì, [3] conveys the belief that 'understanding the Truth helps people grow spiritually day by day'.

- 1. This Latin motto is quoted from 1 Corinthians 3:6 of the New Testament that 'ὁ θεὸς ηὔξανεν' (Greek) or 'God gave the growth'. (NRSV)
- 2. 'Míng Daò' derives from 1 Timothy 2:4 of the New Testament that 'God desires everyone to be saved and to come to the knowledge of the truth.' (NRSV)
- 3. 'Rì Xīn' originates from Lijì-Dàxué that 'On the bathing tub of Tāng, the following words were engraved: "If you can one day renovate yourself, do so from day to day. Yea, let there be daily renovation."



黎校長專訪

以生命育生命,以愛築未來

在教育的長河中,總有一些身影以信念為 舟、以仁愛為獎,默默引領學子駛向理想的彼 岸。本刊有幸專訪前校長黎陳勵女士,聆聽她 投身教育的初心、踐行信仰的感悟,以及對師 生未來的殷切期許。透過她的分享,我們得以 窺見一位教育工作者如何以生命影響生命,在 平凡中孕育不凡。

以生命點亮生命

談及成為基督徒的契機,黎校長坦言,中學時期的校長是她人生中的重要「天使」:「他忠誠、仁慈、充滿愛心,讓我深刻體會到『以生命影響生命』的力量。」這份榜樣的感召,不僅讓她立志投身敎育,更在信仰中尋得使命的根基。她強調:「敎育工作者不僅是知識的傳遞者,更是品格的塑造者。」

對於校訓「明道日新」與「信望愛」,黎校長有獨到的見解:「這些文字不應停留於口號,而需融入日常,化為有血有肉的行動。」十周年校慶時,白約翰主教夫人的到訪令她感受到教育事業的深遠情誼。校友在各行各業締造的佳績,印證了她的信念:「成就不因起點高低而定,努力終會讓微小的雨滴匯成激蕩的江河。」

師生共融,平等相待,互為鏡鑒

黎校長始終以謙卑之心對待師生,視校園為共融的「大家庭」:「我從不覺自己高人一等,同事是家人,學生是責任,無論身在何處,牽掛始終未減。」她引用《馬太福音》5:44的教誨——「要愛你們的仇敵,為逼迫你們的禱告。」——教育應培養寬容與愛的能力。

面對年輕一代,她直言:「現今年輕人缺乏挫折歷練,需學會『恒毅』——克服困難, 迎難而上。」同時,她提醒師生在資訊爆炸的時代保持清醒:「科技越進步,頭腦越需清 醒;語言是橋樑,切莫放棄『兩文三語』的根基。」



才德兼備:教育的根基與使命

黎校長多次強調「才德並重」的重要性:「香港需要通才,但若無品德,世界將陷入 混亂。」作為校長,她以身作則,勉勵老師以品德與學問樹立榜樣;帶領學校課程與時俱 進,重視雙語能力與資優教育;她亦不忘中華傳統美德:「孝心、同理心並非新概念,而 是文化精髓。」

對於跨代責任,她深有感觸:「上一代是『夾心人』,需平衡贍養父母與培育子女; 新一代則需在科技洪流中學會思辨,守護人性的溫度。」

對於老師,黎校長亦有話想説:「留空間與時間喘息,莫讓忙碌消磨初心。」她特別關切老師的健康,呼籲師生彼此關懷,「跨代互動」方能讓經驗與熱忱交融。對於學生,黎校長勸勉我們學習語言的目標要明確,外國人尚能刻苦學習中文,我們更應珍惜母語與英語並用的雙重優勢。

展望未來:以基督之心,繪就教育藍圖

面對變革,黎校長充滿信心:「改變是必然的,但校訓的光亮永不褪色。」她借多年園藝的經驗,以「折枝育苗」為喻,期盼學校在傳承中煥發新生:「願資深老師與年輕新進砥礪傳承,共同守護以基督為本的校園精神。」

她援引《腓立比書》2:4-5寄語全體師生:「各人不要單顧自己的事,也要顧別人的事。當以基督耶穌的心為心。」過度自由與自我中心將瓦解團體意義,唯有「以愛為本, 忠心服務」,方能攜手邁向更美好將來。

黎校長的言語如清泉,滌蕩浮躁;如燈塔,指引方向。在這片以信仰為根基的校園 裏,每一份堅持都在書寫「生命影響生命」的篇章。願我們銘記初心,以愛為舟,共築教 育的星河長明。

Words from Principal Wong



Time flies as the S.K.H. Bishop Baker Secondary School has been serving in Yuen Long for forty years!

Throughout history, GOD has tested his servants through 'forty' to reassure them that despite the pain and distress, his caring hand never disappears. Moses fasted for forty days and nights to prepare himself to receive the law (Exodus 34:28); the Israelites wandered and survived in the desert for forty years (Joshua 5:6); manna rained down on the Israelites for forty years during their sojourn in the desert (Exodus 16:35); and our LORD Jesus Christ ascended into Heaven forty days after His resurrection (Acts 1:3).

Does it happen by chance to be 'forty' days or years in various events? Or, is 'forty' a number deliberately chosen to convey a special meaning to the readers?

There is an inspiring interpretation of 'forty' in the Bible with the traditional use of Gematria. In Hebrew, every letter has a numerical value (Aleph $\aleph=1$, Bet $\beth=2$, Gimel $\lambda=3$, and so forth). Based on calculation closely related to the name of GOD, forty can be the total numerical value of the following Hebrew letters and hence the words: (Yod '10, Dalet 7 4, He $\beth=5$, Vav 1 6; Hand $\beth=14$, Yahweh $\beth=16$)

"Hand of the Yahweh (GOD)"

The number 'forty' is therefore to remind us that even in the most difficult times of trial, **the hand of GOD sustains us**. In line with the revelation from various scriptures, 'forty' brings to mind such qualities as repentance, newness, preparation, self-examination, transformation, task fulfillment, escape from bondage or slavery, nourishment and growth, personal fulfillment with redemption and salvation, and ultimately new generation and new life.

Reminiscing about the years of educating our students over four decades, the School has indeed undergone many challenges, yet has delightfully topped up our accomplishments with professional growth and development: continually upgrading the school facilities at times, having completed the School Improvement Programme (SIP) in 1998 as well as implementing gifted education since then, adopting English as the major Medium Of Instruction (MOI) since 2010, having completed the Voluntary Optimisation of Class Structure Scheme (VOCSS) starting from 2011, tenaciously protecting our students from the negative impact of the social unrest in 2019 and painstakingly supporting students to learn at home during the three years of COVID-19 pandemic from 2020 to 2022. As the number 'forty' connotes, **the hand of GOD sustains us** and it is GOD who makes His Truth shine and life grow.

Thirty years ago, our beloved Mrs. Joan Baker sent her greeting to our 10th School Anniversary with the words adapted from Bishop Baker's writing:

"The Bishop Baker Secondary School should keep you to be your best self, to develop your individuality, but to be responsible men and women in society as part of the family of GOD."

Her gracious reminder has shrewdly and prophetically concluded what we have been striving for in the past decades and will continue to shed light on our mission of delivering Christian education as well as pastoral care for our students and their families.

Psalms 138:7-8 says "Though I walk in the midst of trouble, you preserve me against the wrath of my enemies; you stretch out your hand, and your right hand delivers me. The LORD will fulfill his purpose for me; your steadfast love, O LORD, endures forever. Do not forsake the work of your hands."

Pray that GOD continues to pave the way for the S.K.H. Bishop Baker Secondary School to grow with <u>GRIT</u> (Godliness, Renewal, Integrity, Tenacity) into a good, faithful, and wise servant of GOD!





Gifted Education

Since 1997, our school has upheld the principle of "Gifted Education for All", embedding it into our curriculum and promoting interdisciplinary learning. As a designated Satellite Centre for the Hong Kong Academy for Gifted Education (HKAGE) in New Territories West since 2021, we actively support the broader development of gifted education. This partnership enables us to empower more students to unlock their potential and achieve extraordinary success, fostering a culture of excellence within our community.



Being one of the HKAGE Satellite Centres, we aim to leverage synergistic opportunities to empower more students to shine and excel.



We have offered biotechnology courses and talks for both HKAGE members and our students for the third consecutive year. These included courses on Trends in Modern Biotechnology and talks on Trends in Stem Cell Research and Modern Biotechnology. Student evaluations for these courses consistently exceed the average score for HKAGE courses, with a pass rate of 96%.





1. STEAM Education

Our STEAM education journey is deeply intertwined with the growth of our gifted education programme. The establishment of "Miteen Academy" in 2015 offers tailored programmes to foster the talents of high-potential learners. The launch of the "Secondary School IT Innovation Lab" in 2021, along with the formation of our Robotics and Biochemistry Teams, further fuels students' creativity and innovation, empowering them to explore and excel in cutting-edge fields.



Since 2022, our school's robotics team has proudly represented Hong Kong, China to join different International Robotics Competitions in Switzerland, Denmark, Kazakhstan and the United States. We have achieved significant recognition, including the 2nd place in Ustad Ahmad Lahori Award for innovation in Engineering and the Engineering Excellence Award.





Our scientific research team achieved an outstanding result in the 14th Hong Kong Budding Scientists Award (HKBSA) competition. The research theme of their investigation was "Inhibitory Potential of Natural Flower Teas for the Management of Diabetes". After exploring, investigating, and experimenting with the hypothesis, our team successfully won the Champion Award in the HKBSA competition. In addition, our report on an interview with a scientist, Professor Joseph J.Y. Sung, also won the Reporter Award.





MITEEN ACADEMY, our school team for STEAM, has received financial support of over two million dollars from the Quality Education Fund to engage students and teachers in research on controlled environment agriculture systems and robotic arm design experiments. These projects have been integrated into the curriculum and extended into STEAM gifted education programmes, leading our students to win numerous national and territory-wide awards over the years.





Our school has installed 33 solar panels on our campus rooftop since 2021. This project promotes the application of renewable energy and integrates with our Integrated Science curriculum, allowing students to experience STEAM learning from theory to practical application.





2. Cultural Creativity in Education

Our school prioritises cultural and creative education to meet the demands of the modern era. Chinese history, culture and humanities are integrated to help students develop humanistic qualities, foster respect for tradition and draw creative inspiration. Through blending historical contexts with students' creativity and employing modern multimedia tools, we connect past and future. This approach not only enhances cultural appreciation but also empowers students to engage meaningfully with the socio-cultural landscape, showcasing their growth and innovation.





Our students achieve outstanding results in external multimedia creation competitions. After graduation, they continue to excel and contribute significantly to the creative industries.

3. Sister School Scheme

Since becoming sister schools with Guangzhou Baiyun Middle School in 2019, our five-year partnership has thrived through frequent faculty and student exchanges. Beyond academic and cultural collaboration, we have jointly excelled in classical literature recitation competitions, earning numerous district and provincial awards. Each interaction opportunity is cherished, deepening our friendship and strengthening our commitment to mutual growth and cooperation.





During the critical period of the Covid-19 pandemic, the two schools continued to facilitate meetings and educational exchanges through online platforms, thereby enhancing mutual understanding and professional learning.





Sister School Task Group led over 20 students on their first post-pandemic visit to Guangzhou Baiyun Middle School in June, 2023.

Principal Wong led thirty teachers from our school to visit Guangzhou Baiyun Middle School for formal teaching exchanges in October, 2023.





Teachers from both schools shared successful experiences in Maker Education and STEAM education in recent years.

Our English teachers conducted a class for Guangzhou students and then a productive lesson review with fruitful discussion between English departments to harvest valuable insights.





Since 2020, collaboration with Guangzhou Baiyun Middle School has won multiple awards in the Guangdong-Hong Kong-Macau Classics Recitation Competition at the Guangzhou level. In 2023, both schools recorded a performance together at Guangzhou Television.

Students from both schools held exchange activities, including singing and touring together while sharing their vibrant school lives.









All S2 students and nearly twenty teachers visited the other two campuses of Guangzhou Baiyun Middle School to experience student life in Guangzhou.









In 2022, due to pandemic restrictions, physical exchanges were halted. To foster students' understanding of the sister-school-relationship, a stationery design competition was held.

Learning Centre for Innovative Information Technology

Upgrading space and the underground equipment to promote innovative technology teaching: Since regular classrooms lack sufficient updated computer equipment for STEAM activities, and the design of the Multi-Media Learning Centre (MMLC) no longer meets the escalating needs required for STEAM activities, our school has upgraded the MMLC to a "Learning Centre for Innovative Information Technology" through this Quality Education Fund project with updated equipment and more space planning to benefit other subjects and more students through an e-learning online platform.





Robotic Arm Laboratory

To align with the development needs of the new computer science curriculum for Secondary 1 to Secondary 6, we have designed a series of experiments using robotic arms as the theme to promote STEAM education. Some examples are as follows:


- develop teaching materials for Arduino and Python programming to enhance students' problemsolving skills;
